Stations of the Cross

Stations of the Cross refers to a series of images depicting Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion and accompanying prayers. Praying the Stations of the Cross is among the most ancient of spiritual disciplines, a practice that stretches back to the early centuries of the church. As Katherine Sonderegger says in her book, Praying the Stations of the Cross, Finding *Hope in a Weary Land*, the stations offer a spiritual practice that can refresh us at those times when our souls are parched for God's presence in our lives. Eight Stations of the Cross have been set up in our sanctuary for the season of Lent - there are devotion booklets for you to use. We invite you to spend some time and prayer and to reflect on the scripture at each stop. 


Holy Week Plans




Lectionary readings for March are: + March 7th, Third Sunday In Lent – Exodus 20:1-17 (the commandments are given at Sinai), Psalm 19 (the commandment of the Lord gives light to the eyes), 1 Corinthians 1:18-25 (Christ crucified, the wisdom of God), John 2:13-22 (the cleansing of the temple)

+ March 14th, Fourth Sunday in Lent – Numbers 21:4-9 (the lifting up of the serpent), Psalm 107:103, 17-22 (you deliver your people from their distress), Ephesians 2:1-10 (saved by grace through faith for good works, John 3:14-21 (the lifting up of the Son of Man)

+ March 21st, Fifth Sunday in Lent –Jeremiah 31:31-34 (a new covenant written on the heart), Psalm 51:1-12 (create in me a clean heart, O God), Hebrews 5:5-10 (through suffering Christ becomes the source of salvation), John 12:20-33 (the grain of wheat dying in the earth)

+ March 28th, Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday–Isaiah 50:4-9 (the servant of the Lord submits to suffering), Psalm 31:9-16 (into your hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit), Philippians 2:5-11 (humbled to the point of death on a cross), Mark 14:1-15:47 (the passion of the Lord). 





New Website for Apostles Lutheran Church



At Apostles, we make a weekend out of it—we work on Saturday and worship on Sunday—we aren't sure exactly what it will look like this year but stay tuned!!


Meals for Gloucester United Emergency Shelter Team (GUEST)


