Two years ago, I packed up my entire life in Upstate New and departed for a town

I had only heard of a few months before my egress. After relying upon the hospitality of the Scholz's and Britt's for temporary housing and transportation, I moved into the Pink House on Main Street and started my ministry with Apostles Lutheran. We really started off with a bang until a once in a century Pandemic left us dazed and confused. Lockdowns, canceled trips, social distancing, mask mandates, and worst of all no takeout! Now I never got on the bread baking bandwagon having left my break maker to a friend Upstate, but like many of you, I learned how to navigate the new normal. Then that became shattered and discarded for the newest normal, then came the *new*, new normal, the normal 2.0, which gave way to the nouveau normal. It became normal to embrace the abnormal, which only came with the guarantee that things would change tomorrow. I asked you all to go along with some crazy ideas: recording for Christmas Eve before Advent 3, rhyming the liturgy, and embracing life online. These maneuvers seemed out of left field, but they were all apart of a carefully thought-out plan that took months to prepare. Now that we are

back in our building, we can adapt to this particular way of being God's people that combines the familiar customs of the past with the innovative habits we discovered during 2020. We will host an in-person Adult Forum dedicated to inclusive language followed by an online Blessing of Animals on October 3rd. Ministerium was canceled due to COVID this year, but I will be taking an extended Sabbath from October 17th to October 30th. We welcome and thank Pastor Sandy Wisco for supplying during Sunday Worship while Pastor Alex Wit is available for Pastoral Emergencies while I'm gone. We will end October celebrating Reformation Day as a newly formed Reconciling in Christ Community with our guest preacher, Pastor Kelly Bayer Derrick. 


Please Join Us For Bible Study


Readings for October

- + October 3rd—19th Sunday after Pentecost Genesis 2:18-24 (created for relationship), Psalm 8 (you crown us with glory and honor), Hebrews 1:1-4; 2:5-12 (God has spoken by a Son), Mark 10:2-16 (teaching on marriage)
- + October 10th—20th Sunday after Pentecost Amos 5:6-7, 10-15 (turn from injustice to the poor, that you may live), Psalm 90:12-17 (so teach us to number our days that we may apply our hearts to wisdom), Hebrews 4:12-16 (approach the throne of grace with boldness), Mark 10:17-31 (teaching on wealth and reward)
- + October 17th—17th Sunday after Pentecost Isaiah 53:4-12 (the suffering servant), Psalm 91:9 -16 (you have made the Lord your refuge, and the Most High your habitation), Hebrews 5:1-10 (through suffering Christ becomes the source of salvation), Mark 10:35-45 (warnings to ambitious disciples)
- + October 24th—22nd Sunday after Pentecost Jeremiah 31:7-9 (the Lord gathers the remnant of Israel), Psalm 126 (those who sowed with tears will reap with songs of joy), Hebrews 7:23-28 (Christ the merciful high priest), Mark 10:46-52 (Christ healing the blind man Bartimaeus)
- + October 31st—Reformation Day Jeremiah 31:31-34 (I will write my law in their hearts, says the Lord), Psalm 46 (the Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold), Romans 3:19-28 (justified by God's grace as a gift), John 8:31-36 (Jesus says, continue in my word and you will know the truth)
